Roads Report

- 2019 Road Bids were opened at the County Engineer's Office. Their estimate was \$33,057.20 for asphalt work on Buffham Road between Westfield and Lake Road.

 only happen during business hours it is not a 24-hour facility. They may have a poly-tank

- Evans stated that Generator Systems is going to inspect the 40K generator and it may work for the Safety Services Building. Trustee Likley will check with Simmons Brothers Construction.

- Old Truck wash on Lake Road is an unsafe structure. The Building Inspector is sending a report
 and Chief Fletcher will supplement the findings with his concerns about safety. A title search is
